BURLEY PARISH COUNCIL

Burley Parish Council met on Wednesday 13th April with Cllr Philip Daubeney in the chair, and Cllrs John Cook, Peter Egerton, Veronica Johnstone and Robert Clarke.

Also present, District Cllrs Martin Levitt and Richard Frampton, Kate Hedge, five members of the public and the clerk, Tom Brindley.

Public representation. The council received presentations regarding planting of trees in Pound Lane. As a result of the public consultation, the number of trees has been reduced from ten to eight.

The council also heard from Lucy Bramley representing the Women's Institute.

District Cllr Richard Frampton updated the council on the change to wheelie bins and explained how this was both a safety measure, to protect operatives from injury caused by sharps in bags, and also a measure to increase the recycling rate from a national low of around 35% to a more acceptable 55%. The strategy change would allow for recycling of food waste. While the strategy was for alternate weekly collections, the total amount of waste collected would increase due to kerbside collection of bottles and plastics.

District Cllr Levitt spoke positively of his experience when wheelie bins were introduced in Hertfordshire which had significantly driven up recycling rates.

Platinum Jubilee The council noted the many events planned to celebrate HM Queen Elizabeth's platinum jubilee including (subject to change):

Thursday 2nd June 21:45 Lighting the beacon, Dan Tanners land off Chapel Lane. This is a nationwide event and The Waltham Bartlett will be providing a pay bar and BBQ from 19:00-22:30.

Saturday 4th June The Waltham Bartlett has live music and other entertainment from 12:00 to 23:00.

Saturday 4th June The church is planning a 'street party' on the vicarage drive and garden on Saturday afternoon.

Sunday 5th June Picnic in the Park, Dan Tanners land off Chapel Lane. 12:00-16:00. residents can bring own food and drink.

Finances: Members noted the council's finances are in a healthy state with adequate reserves and funds to deliver a full programme of services to the community and support for local organisations.

Tree planting The planting of eight replacement oak trees in Pound Lane will be completed before the end of May. The planting of trees in Cotts Lane is deferred to the autumn pending the result of the appeal to the Verderer's court for the full complement of twelve trees.

Removal of fir trees Councillors noted that the project for removing trees at Slap Bottom had been suspended and no further removal was planned.

Planning The council considers every planning application in detail and makes recommendations to the New Forest National Park Authority NFNPA.
