ROADS AND TRAFFIC BPC has given Hampshire Highways feedback following the recent closure of the C10. This is with a view to lessons being learnt for the forthcoming closure for the replacement of Holmsley Bridge (due to start next year): 30mph Speed Indicator Devices on diversion routes will be investigated by the traffic management team, as well as additional signage for lorries and buses. The pinch points in Ringwood Road now have white give-way road markings in place and foliage affecting visibility will be cleared by Hampshire Highways. BPC will also be nominating a list of paths to be cleared around the village as part of the vegetation cutting list for clearing Right of Way paths.

REPORT POTHOLES At this time of year more potholes seem to appear with the inclement weather. SLAP BOTTOM Forestry England has received a felling licence to remove 232 trees at Slap Bottom - BPC objected to this application with a view that in the light of climate change more trees should be planted and the necessity for any felling should be based on extensive scientific evidence.
