LENGTHSMAN This month the Lengthsman will clear the ditch by the kitchen shop in Ringwood Road with a digger, to prevent flooding during the winter months. Householders are reminded that keeping ditches and culverts clear that run through or adjoin a property, is the responsibility of the householder. This is essential to prevent flooding during inclement weather; particularly at this time of year following the build-up of debris from trees dropping their leaves.
