ROADS AND TRAFFIC It has been a busy summer facilitating traffic projects in Burley: You may already have noticed that noisy manhole covers have now been replaced in the centre of the village; despite renewed efforts a further request for “20-is-plenty” speed signs has again been declined by Hampshire Highways (HH); we await notification of a date for work on pinch points in the village from HH; Cllr Martin has met with a HCC project manager to discuss the plans for the Holmsley Bridge replacement project – this was very informative and he was also able to pass on further considerations that the project will need to address before it begins next year. The lack of a path between the Village Car Park and the end of Chapel Lane continues to be a sensitive issue with many residents. Attempts to have a path installed have failed due to sensitivities with Natural England and the Verderers. Requests for additional hoggin to be laid on the road edge have been made to HCC however, these requests have been declined and we have been advised that the situation will continue to be monitored. As the result of recent Festival activity, the feasibility of installing dragons teeth to prevent cars parking on the verge is being explored.

POST BOX You may be pleased to hear that following pressure from BPC, Royal Mail have confirmed that they will be moving the Post Box from its current position on double yellow lines to a location close to the Post Office at Shappen Stores. We have yet to receive information on when this work will be carried out. Watch this space!

GRANT BPC has given a grant of £250 to The Burley Charities this month.

WAR MEMORIAL BPC would like to thank the Royal British Legion for fundraising in aid of the War Memorial engraving project. Our heart-felt thanks also go to those that made donations. The project is now completed and the donations made cover the cost of the engraving as well as a small surplus which has been placed in the dedicated War Memorial maintenance fund held by BPC.
