POLICE REPORT PC Dave Caffyn reported that there has been a slight increase in break-ins to non-dwelling buildings in Burley of late. He suggested the following crime prevention measures: make a record of the make, model and serial number of valuable items to make them easily identifiable; use plug-in timers with lights and radios; motion detecting security lights should be fitted high up so they cannot be tampered with; some security lights are available with a motion sensor camera attached however these should be viewed as a crime prevention measure rather than a detection method; use anchor bolts into concrete garage floors for items such as tractors; use alarmed padlocks. As always please remain vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour directly to the police.

PHONE BOX BT have placed a poster in the phone box in the centre of the village (near Howards Close) informing of a consultation period and of their intention to remove both the telephone and the kiosk. This telephone is very rarely used, and BPC is looking into the possibility of it being replaced by a reclaimed red phone box to be used for an alternative purpose, such as a book exchange.

NOTICEBOARD As you may already have noticed there is a new noticeboard at Shappen stores. This will be used for BPC notices as well as village event posters. Please speak to Shappen Stores if you wish to display an A4 (or smaller) notice of local interest.

SECOND VILLAGE DEFIBRILLATOR It is with great thanks to Mrs Casswell's generous donation that Burley now has a second village defibrillator located at Shappen Stores. This will be dedicated to Mrs Casswell's late husband and a brass plaque will shortly be installed next to the defibrillator.
