

## **BURLEY PARISH COUNCIL**

The May meeting of Burley Parish Council had to be postponed until Monday 16<sup>th</sup> May, after the magazine publication deadline. Draft minutes are available on the council website: [www.burleyparishcouncil.gov.uk](http://www.burleyparishcouncil.gov.uk).

Meanwhile, the council continues to deliver on its objectives: eight oak trees have been planted in Pound Lane. The council continues to lobby the Verderers to allow trees to be planted in Cotts Lane to celebrate the platinum jubilee. The Greening project is progressing. The council is working with New Forest National Park Authority to deliver two affordable homes. The Emergency Plan has been published. Two defibrillators are installed and maintained at council expense. The council works closely with the planning authorities to ensure development is appropriate and is liaising with Hampshire County Council to deliver a new building for the Little Deers Day Nursery.

The next meeting is scheduled for 18:30 on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> June in the Myrtle Hall.
