1 Public Participation Two planning applicants spoke about their application to be considered under Item 15

3 Declarations of Interest None

4 Approval of Minutes of the full BPC meeting held on 8th July 2020 Resolved – Having been previously circulated, the Minutes and Clerk's report for the last meeting were agreed.

5 Matters Arising and Clerk's Report. As shown in the Clerk's report the balance of the current account on 30th August was £9,463.84. The online payments detailed in the Clerk's report were approved. Cllr Egerton confirmed that he had checked the online statements for July and for August.

Additional payments agreed: Cllr Clarke ink £128.99

Fencing at Sandy Shoot – NM reported this to Hampshire Highways (HH) and is awaiting a response.

6. Consideration of when future BPC meetings may recommence in public Decision deferred

7. Consideration of Victim Support grant Agreed: £100 as budgeted (SG)

8. Remembrance Sunday and road closures A road closure application has been submitted by the Clerk. However arrangements are currently unknown due to the changing COVID restrictions.

9. Approval of new noticeboard purchase for the center of the village A quote of £1270 was obtained for a new noticeboard. A quote to renovate the current noticeboard will be obtained. Decision deferred.

10. Broadband update Several areas of the village are looking into applying for improved broadband services. Various areas of Burley have a coordinator listing those households interested. These will be sent to Openreach who evaluate the properties and provide a cost to install fiber to the properties. A £3000 grant per property is available to apply for. A 15 working day response time is expected from Openreach.

11. Licensing NFDC are holding a licensing hearing for the upcoming Fairy Festival. A hearing was not held for the Dogstival. Dogstival appeared to have little impact on the number of people in the village, however some verge parking was witnessed and the volume of traffic coming into the village was compounded; Dogstival appeared to be well managed despite the high numbers of visitors. It was discussed whether an appeal to the Director of Public Health should be sought if the license is agreed for the Fairy Festival: it was generally thought that there would be little scope for this and that it was not understood why a hearing was initiated by NFDC for the Fairy Festival and not Dogstival. (PD)

12. Emergency Plan Update Nothing further to report.

The salt bins seem to be full of dog waste bags (NM)

13. Burley Watch update This is working well with updates going out every month.

14 Roads and Traffic Report Cllr Martin reported that:

- He received an email from a resident in Burley Hill regarding the traffic calming pinch points who felt that the increased volume of traffic over the summer has resulted in tail backs, noise and fumes. He requests the removal of the pinch points – this was not agreed. Another elector has requested further traffic calming measures. It was agreed that a Speed indicator devices would be investigated (NM)

- UK Cycling events has a new director, who has committed to reduce the number of participants in events to 1000 to comply with the Cycling Charter. The next scheduled event is on 19/20th Sept, coming through village centre – departure times to be staggered.
 - It was agreed that temporary dragon’s teeth will be sought from the green man to chapel lane (NM)
 - As there are drainage issues and struggling water pumps in the village, Wessex Water are investigating the possibility of installing a new underground reservoir in North Park for the overflow of flood and grey water which can then be pumped to Ringwood. This is still under discussion and an on-site meeting is due soon.
 - Path from the centre of the village to Chapel Lane - cost estimate is £10,000. Funding would be required as this would not be supplied by HH. (NM)
 - Foliage in Forest Road is encroaching on the road. (NM to speak to HH)
- Lengthsman – will carry out repairs to noticeboard Burley Street this month.
