ROADS AND TRAFFIC BPC has spoken to HCC to revisit the possibility of a 20mph speed limit though the village; HCC advised that a further request is unlikely to result in a change to speed limits. The feasibility of a zebra crossing in the village was also discussed, BPC was advised that it is unlikely to be workable for a number of reasons. HCC did suggest the Community Speedwatch scheme, which BPC has tried to initiate

previously. A number of community funded traffic measures such as gateway markers at the entrance to village have also been suggested by HCC.

The collapsed manhole at the end of Esdaile Lane has been referred to the “Flood and Water Management” team at HCC. We will continue to monitor until this is resolved.

Beachwood Lane has experienced some verge creep resulting in the road being narrowed – Hampshire Highways have confirmed that they will carry out a survey.

A letter of complaint will be sent to Highways England regarding replacement of the cattle grid at Picket Post (A31). The length of time it will take to replace and the timing of the works (over the May half-term holiday) will be mentioned in particular.

**JAPANESE KNOTWEED** We have received some helpful advice from Forestry England on how best to eradicate Japanese Knotweed. This invasive species must be given a treatment that travels down to destroy the plant from the roots - if it is pulled up it will resprout.

**LITTER PICK** BPC would like to thank all 12 volunteers who helped at the BPC Spring Litter Pick on 6th June, including Sir Desmond Swayne MP. BPC has now purchased its own litter pick equipment, so we are fully equipped for future litter picks without having to borrow from the local authority. 14 bags of rubbish were collected.
