

BURLEY PARISH COUNCIL

Burley Parish Council met on Wednesday 9th March with Cllr Philip Daubeney in the chair, and Cllrs John Cook, Peter Egerton, Veronica Johnstone and Robert Clarke.

Also present, John Vincent, Kate Copelin, five members of the public and, by telephone, the clerk, Tom Brindley.

Draft minutes are available on the council website.

Public representation. The council received a presentation from Sarah-Jane Finch of McDonalds. Ms Finch described how the restaurant was working with the village to control litter and planned a letter pick on 6th April.

Dr Anna Lawrence addressed the council on fallen trees. Dr Lawrence advised that trees felled in a storm seldom regenerated as saplings were eaten by grazing animals. She was collating a register of fallen trees and asked that the public contribute using the what3words app. In order to avoid duplication, volunteer recorders were requested to always stand to the right of the base of the fallen tree and wait 30-40 seconds to allow an accurate fix on the position. Then to use the "Share" function within the app to email:

annalawrence37@gmail.com, using the subject line of the email to record species and number of fallen trees, so that newly destroyed trees can be added to the existing list.

Other questions were asked on the progress of the bridge replacement and the war in Ukraine.

General Power of Competence The council adopted this power which was made available as part of the Localism act 2011. The council now has the power to do anything an individual citizen can do including, for the first time, the power to give grants to individuals.

Platinum Jubilee The council noted the many events planned to celebrate HM Queen Elizabeth's platinum jubilee including (subject to change):

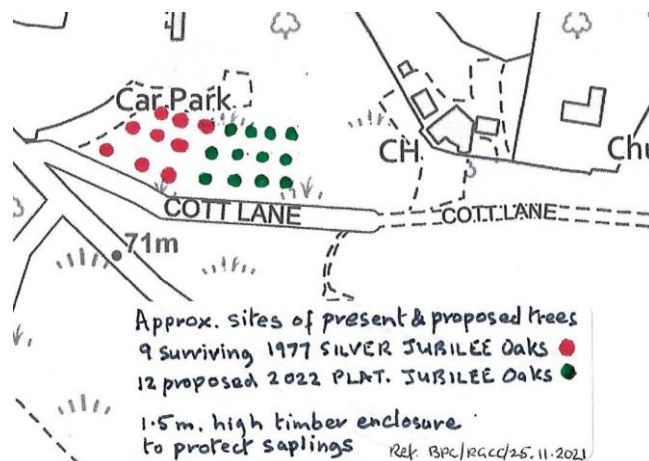
