An extra meeting of the BPC Planning Committee has been specially arranged for 6.30p.m. in Myrtle Hall on 19th October 2015 to consider the re-newed application from Mr T. Adams for a New dwelling and associated landscaping (demolition of existing outbuildings) on the site of Manor Farm Cottage, Forest Road. In the usual way, the meeting will be open to all with an initial period set aside for public participation.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION-PLAY AREA A member of the public spoke of her concern that parents at the primary school have been largely unaware of initial meetings being held between the school and BPC, regarding a potential play area. The Chairman said that during public consultation a play area was the most popular project to benefit from surplus money from Jubilee celebrations. The project is only at the initial investigation and viability stage; the project is tentative and there is currently no clear way forward, with many hurdles to cross before going ahead. The project will not proceed without the backing of the village. If the project appears viable public consultation will be held at a public meeting, publicised in the village magazine, on the noticeboard and by posters around the village.

SUPERFAST BROADBAND Glenn Peacey (HCC) and John Taylor (Openreach) attended the meeting to discuss progress with the Superfast Broadband programme.

Currently one of the two new Burley broadband cabinets is now installed and working. The second cabinet is to be sited at Lester Square. There is now agreement from Natural England and the Verderers that a bench can be moved to locate the second broadband box. Mr Taylor and Mr Peacey said BPC's involvement has been very helpful. There is still paperwork to complete with the land agent but once completed the work will not physically take very long.

EMERGENCY PLAN There are currently forms available around the village to register to be placed on the Emergency Priority Register. These can be returned to the Post Office or Mormons. However if you prefer please return the form in an envelope marked "Private and Confidential" to any member of Burley Parish Council.

BUSES The Morebus service will continue through the winter months and will hopefully continue next year.

ROADS AND TRAFFIC Cllr Martin reported that: cattle grid repairs at Warnes Lane are now complete; pothole repairs and line painting have been on going over the last month; the path in the centre of the village will be extended from the cycle shop, past the tearoom to the bus stop. This will be done by Hampshire Highways and should be finished by the end of the current financial year.

BURLEY HERITAGE A meeting was held on 14th September where it was agreed to investigate the setting up a trust. The name "Burley Village Heritage Trust" will be used, as "Burley Heritage Trust" is already registered with the Charity Commission.

LITTER PICK Special thanks to all those who participated in the Litter Pick on 4th October. On a lovely Autumn afternoon 12 good people gathered and collected 15 sacks of the usual (but extraordinary) mix of rubbish and helped to restore Burley to a more attractive state again.
