Publically Accessible Defibrillator Project Mr Mike Jukes of Bransgore First Responders spoke to the Council about Publically Accessible Defibrillators which are used to treat Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA). No training is necessary to use the equipment as full instruction and support is given after dialling 999. The equipment increases survival rates from 6% to up to 74% in a patient suffering SCA and the equipment will only shock a patient if their condition requires it i.e. the equipment monitors the patient's heart. It was agreed that equipment will be purchased through the ambulance service and placed in a secure, weather proof box at the Village Hall.

Victim support grant A £75 grant to Victim Support as set out in the budget was approved and paid.

Burley Emergency Plan BPC are currently updating the Emergency Plan and are still looking for volunteers to help, we are particularly looking for someone who can over-see the scheme as a whole. If you are able to offer your time please contact the clerk on (07503) 203399.

Hanging Baskets As mentioned last month, Burley will be seeing the addition of 25 hanging baskets to the village. BPC would like to thank Alan Mould and his team at Spencers Estate Agents for their generous donation towards this project.

It would also be appreciated if after picking up, dog bags could be put in a bin or taken home and not left on the ground. Thank you for your cooperation.

Fortune Riding Centre Cllr Kendall reported that 4 Councillors attended a talk at the Fortune Riding Centre that caters for up to 44 young people with special needs, teaching life skills. It was reported that many people hold misconceptions about the work the centre does and that they would like more visitors to address this. An open day is being held on 19th June.

Roads and Traffic Cllr Martin reported that he would be sending a summary of outstanding issues to Hampshire Highways and that estimated timescales for completion will be requested.

War Memorial The War Memorial and the stone outside the Burley Inn will be cleaned week commencing 14th July in preparation for WW1 commemorations.

Cycling Cllr Martin reported that BPC have submitted comments to NFNPA on the draft Cycling Charter. Feedback from all Parish Councils is currently being consolidated by NFNPA.
