## FINANCE COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES 7<sup>th</sup> DECEMBER 2022

**1 Apologies for absence: None.**

**2 Declarations of interest:** Cllr Cook declared an interest in a potential grant to Burley Charities

**3 Public participation: None**

**3. To receive an update on expenditure in 2022/23 with budget comparison and year-end forecast**

3.1 Members noted the year-end forecast was for net payments of £21,386 including recoverable VAT of £142 (2022/23 budget £21,226).

3.2 Members noted the year end forecast was for net receipts of £17,098 (budget 2022/23 budget £13,467). Additional income had been received in the form of grants from HCC (£400), NFDC (£600) and money passported by Bransgore PC from HCC for the Lengthsman scheme (£1,100)

3.3 Members noted the year-end forecast was for net cash of £23,281 held in the council's three bank accounts.

**4 To consider the budget proposals for 2023/24**

4.1 The clerk presented his budget proposals which members considered and made the following changes:

1. Reduce the money assigned to Greening from £2,000 to £1,000.
2. Reduce planned grants received from £400 to £0.

**5 To consider the precept recommendation for 2023/24**

5.1 Members noted that the proposed budget required the use of reserves. To ensure money is available for future years, members agreed to recommend a precept of £20.28 per band D household (an increase of 10%) which would bring in £16,295.

**6 Members RESOLVED to make the following recommendations to Full Council:**

- a) To budget for payments of £22,809 (see Table 1 annexed)
- b) To budget for receipts of £16,345 (see Table 2 annexed)
- c) To assign earmarked reserves (see Table 4 annexed)
- d) To set the precept per band D household at £20.28 (see Table 4 annexed)

**2 Chairman's Remarks:** The chairman noted that item 21 Planning was a duplicate of item 11 Planning which had been brought forward so that members of the public would not have to wait until the end of the meeting.

**3 Declarations of interest: None at this time**

**4 Public participation:**

4.1 The council's external representative on the Bournemouth Airport Consultative Committee reported on the Airspace Modernisation Plan affecting all southern airports including Bournemouth and Southampton.

**5 (Agenda item 5) Reports from higher authorities:**

**6 (Agenda item 6) Reports from outside bodies**

6.1 Cllr Clarke referred members to the report he had circulated regarding the New Forest National Park consultancy panel. The clerk was asked to add this to the January agenda.

7.1 Members **RESOLVED** to accept these minutes as a true record of the meetings and the chairman was authorised to sign.

**9 (Agenda item 9) Clerk's report**

9.1 The clerk presented his report including payments due and an updated asset list. The clerk was asked to add two bus shelters to the list and to inspect them for damage.

12.1 The clerk reported he had now received the name of the chair of the trustees and would write a letter suggesting a roll over of the existing lease terms.

13 (Agenda item 13) 'Dixon Land' and affordable social housing project: The chairman reported he had written to the Director of Planning at NFNPA asking for an update.

## 14 (Agenda item 14) Maintenance of Village Environment including Greening project

14.1 Cllr Hedge advised that The Cider Pantry had agreed to host recycling bins to take items not currently collected by NFDC.

14.2 A leaflet will be required to publicise this recycling initiative.

14.3 The second instalment of the subscription has been requested by the Greening Campaign. Members approved the £50 payment.

14.4 The Soup Kitchen was operating and had 12 users in week one and 20 in week two.

## 15 (Agenda item 15) Broadband

15.1 Members reported that Openreach had issued vouchers for residents in and around Bisterne Close to sign up for fibre broadband, which should be available in February 2023.

## 16 (Agenda item 16) Correspondence

16.1 The clerk reported a significant increase in calls and emails regarding Burley-In-Wharfedale parish council which uses an email and web address of burleyparishcouncil.co.uk. The clerk was asked to write to Burley-In-Wharfedale asking if they would consider changing their address to avoid confusion.

## 17 (Agenda item 17) Legal Matters and Licensing Application

17.1 Members noted several TENS applications. The clerk had circulated a note explaining the complexity of TENS applications and referred members to the NFDC web site.

## 18 (Agenda item 18) Road and Traffic update

18.1 Cllr Cook reported on his discussions with Forestry England (FE) regarding the path from the NFDC car park to Church Lane. FE were considering installing signage and "dragons teeth" kerbing to protect the verge.

18.2 Cllr Cook had established the name of the person within Forestry England to whom incidents of fly tipping on forestry land should be reported.

18.3 Cllr Cook had drafted an article regarding householders' responsibility for clearing ditches, to be published in the village magazine.

### NFDC Public Space Protection Orders proposal (Agenda Item 12)

NFDC has proposed two PSPOs, which look to ban the lighting of fires and use of BBQs principally on the Crown Lands managed by Forestry England, and the feeding and petting of ponies, horses, mules, and donkeys in the New Forest. See maps at [www.newforest.gov.uk/PSPOmap1](http://www.newforest.gov.uk/PSPOmap1) and [www.newforest.gov.uk/PSPOmap2](http://www.newforest.gov.uk/PSPOmap2) for proposed restricted areas. Background information and the online consultation forms can be accessed at [www.newforest.gov.uk/publicspaceprotectionorders](http://www.newforest.gov.uk/publicspaceprotectionorders).

If approved, the PSPOs would allow Fixed Penalty Notices to be issued with penalties of up to £100, or a fine of up to £1,000 with a Magistrates' Court prosecution.

The consultation is in the form of an online form, reproduced as Annexe 1.

Can I request members that prepare any comments and their preferred responses before the meeting (and if possible let me know so I can present a coordinated response) so that we do not spend an inordinate amount of time during the meeting.

## **2023 Annual Parish Meeting [assembly] (Agenda Item 13)**

Parish and Town councils must hold an Annual Parish Meeting (the parish assembly) between 1<sup>st</sup> March and 1<sup>st</sup> June (inclusive) each year.

The choices for 2023 are:

- 1) hold the meeting before the election
- or
- 2) hold the meeting after the election

While there are merits in both, my recommendation is that the meeting is held **before the elections**. This gives the outgoing council the opportunity to inform residents of the work the council and other community organisations have done in the past year and to answer questions. If the meeting was deferred until after the election the new council might not have knowledge and ownership of previous decisions, although this is unlikely to be a problem in Burley, would likely not have time to formulate its policies and goals for the next four year cycle. However, it is important that the meeting is not used to influence either the parish council or district elections.

There is no reason why the new council couldn't hold a second parish meeting later in the year should it wish to communicate a new four year strategy.

## **Coronation of King Charles III (Agenda Item 14)**

The coronation of King Charles III will take place on Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> May 2023. Monday 8<sup>th</sup> May 2023 will be a national bank holiday.

The parish council elections will take place on Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> May, but new councillors do not take their seats until four days after the election, which is Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> May, meaning that even if there was a change of membership, current councillors will still be in office on Monday 8<sup>th</sup>.
