#### FULL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES 22<sup>nd</sup> SEPTEMBER 2025

In attendance: 7 members of the public, Cllr Nigel Linford (NFDC), Cllr R Frampton (NFDC), the Clerk.

### 1 Apologies for absence None

- **2** Chairman's Remarks The Chairman has attended two presentations by the leader of HCC regarding Local Government Reorganisation (LGR); HCC prefers the proposal that incorporates the New Forest with Southampton and Eastleigh. Comments have been submitted by BPC to the consultation, stating that BPC is not in favour of this option. BPC supports NFDC's view that the New Forest is not put in an area with Southampton & Eastleigh.
- 3 Declarations of interest Cllr Egerton declared an interest in planning application 25/00854FULL Bisterne Close. Cllr Egerton will leave the room while this application is being discussed and decided.
  - Cllr Radley declared a non-pecuniary interest in 14 Honey Lane as she knows the applicants.
- **Public participation** A member of the public came to speak about the volume of traffic travelling through the village towards Picket Post. The Chairman said that BPC is taking steps to address speed but cannot control the volume of traffic. "20 is plenty" has previously been turned down by HCC. Cllr Radley said that a Speed Device application has been made to NFDC; this records speed and volume of traffic and evidence is collected. Cllr Cook said that he would ask the police to attend with speed cameras if possible (JC).

A member of the public from Burley Heritage Trust attended to discuss the variation to condition application. This will not be considered by BPC as BPC has not been invited to consult by NFNPA; this is because the application is a variation to condition and not a full application.

The applicants of 14 Honey Lane planning application confirmed to Cllr Egerton that they intend to address concerns raised by the NFNPA in the application i.e. the increase in size is believed to be over 30%, and the dormer windows on the garage.

- 5 District and County Council reports Cllrs Frampton and Linford spoke about:
  - LGR, saying that NFDC's preferred option includes New Forest, Test valley and East Hampshire.
  - Cllrs attended a meeting on the appraisal of phase 2 of the rollout of wheeled bins. An
    extraordinary meeting was held at NFDC to discuss a slowdown of the second phase to address
    issues that had arisen elsewhere. Pannage season is a concern food bins need to remain
    within the curtilage of properties. Cllr Radley stated that extra NFDC staff have been employed
    for food waste collection.
  - There is a Community Lottery scheme for good causes and Parish Councils can register. (SG)
  - There is a Community grants NFDC program with 2 schemes, one for revenue to support ongoing running costs and another for capital grants for one off projects. Applications must be received by 31st October. 02380 285693 (MR)

- **BPC annual insurance renewal** A one year premium, rather than a long-term agreement with Zurich was approved, at a reduced cost of £986.14, due to Deer Hall no longer being insured by BPC.
- **Set a date and venue for BPC Christmas Carols** Proposed details: Venue The Burley Inn; date Monday 15<sup>th</sup> December; this is subject to venue and Ringwood & Burley band availability. Start time will be 6.30pm. (SG)
- 13 Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> November road closures Road closures to be arranged as is usual (SG).

- 15 Clerks Report inc. finance
  - i) To note payments made and due, and to approve discretionary payments The payments detailed in the clerk's report were approved. Additional payments were approved to: Cllr Daubeney for £28.94 and £6.16; payment to Cllr Egerton for £113.98 for speed signs at Deer Hall.
  - **ii) To note the bank reconciliation** Completed and checked by Cllr Cook and Cllr Egerton prior to the meeting.
- Village Development Cllr Hedge said that a community Speedwatch camera would cost £3600 inc VAT; with this particular model being supported by the police and is used by many speed watch groups. A grant application to be made by KH. The machine would be built to order, taking approximately 8 weeks.
- 17 Legal Matters and Licensing Application All licensing applications had been previously circulated.
